

- Grow in our Catholic vibrancy and be filled with families, children, and young adults




STRATEGIC PLANNING IMPERATIVES (CONTINUED)

- Provide premiere Catholic education on the Northwest side through growing enrollment in our school and religious programs





Northwest Milwaukee Catholic Parishes Statistics 2005-2023







TRI-PARISH COLLABORATION FOR CATHOLIC VIBRANCY IN MKE NW







HISTORY

- September 2021 -- St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Good Hope, along with the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, committed to work together to develop a plan for the betterment of our Catholic community in Northwest Milwaukee.
- Fall 2021 The purpose and scope of the project is defined. The project plan and organization are developed.
- January 2022 A project Team Kick-off event was held. Interviews of representatives from both parishes and community leaders are conducted. The three workgroups (Evangelization & Liturgy, Community Engagement & Education, Facilities & Finance) determine the current situation.
- June 2022 St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Good Hope's workgroups continue to develop recommendations for the future state of the collaborating parishes within each area of the strategic plan. St. Catherine of Alexandria Parish forms a separate steering committee and assembles workgroups following the model of St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Good Hope.

August 2022 – The priests of the three parishes begin meeting with Michael Laird for the Missionary Planning and Leadership office at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.



HISTORY

- October 2022 The Combined Steering Committee with membership from all three parishes is formed.
- November 1, 2022 Fr. Greg becomes the Temporary Administrator of St.
 Catherine of Alexandria Parish.
- Fall of 2022 The Combined Workgroups (Evangelization & Liturgy, Community Engagement & Education, Facilities & Finance, and Special Assignments) are formed.
- January April 2023 Fr. Greg is on Sabbatical. The Combined workgroups continue meeting and develop recommendations.
- May June 2023 Final recommendation are received from workgroups.
- Summer 2023 A summary of the workgroup recommendations is prepared by the Combined Steering Committee.

September & October 2023: Town Hall Meetings

Fall 2023 – Implementation phase of the Strategic Planning process begins.

- Research, train, and implement programs to invite seekers to learn about the Catholic faith.


EVANGELIZATION



- Create an Evangelization Committee that is a subcommittee to the Christian Formation Committee or Pastoral Council.
- Expand St. Catherine's Communication / Marketing Committee to include all three parishes, reporting to the Pastoral Council. (IN PROGRESS)
- Expand the St. Catherine Parish Life Committee to include representation from all three parishes as a committee directly reporting to the Pastoral Council. (IN PROGRESS)
- Identify or hire a person or agency responsible for communication, marketing, and webmaster function.

- Offer a weekly "teaching moment" as part of Mass.
- Create a single Prayer & Worship Committee to represent all three parishes. (DONE)
- Provide liturgical consistency in Masses at all three parishes, including music, monthly praise Masses, announcements, and other liturgical requirements.

- Create a single choir with members from all three parishes that rotates among the parishes for Masses. (IN PROGRESS)
- Establish a defined budget dedicated to supporting formation and training of the lay volunteers every budget cycle and communicate it to the Prayer & Worship chairperson for tracking purposes.
- Offer additional liturgies as interest is expressed and supported by the Prayer & Worship Committee.



- Continue to remind and encourage all welcoming behaviors at each church building on an ongoing basis.
- Provide necessary administrative support for the Director of Liturgy & Music, especially in the area of copy editing.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT - Education



- Conduct three NWMCP Human
 Concerns drives per year to benefit
 Northwest Catholic School. (DONE)
- The parish and school staff will develop a plan to increase communication.
- Fifteen parishioners will volunteer for breakfast or lunchroom duty, field trip chaperones, tutors during and after school, office help. Completing the Safeguarding course will be required.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT – Aging



- With the assistance of Aurora Health Care, the parish nurse will conduct a survey of parishioners over 55 to determine their interest in participating in educational, health, and social activities. (IN PROGRESS)
- The parish nurse will run a minimum of one program per month for people over 55 in 2023. Participants will be surveyed to see if the programs are meeting their needs. (IN PROGESS)

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT – Aging





- A senior activity committee (made up of parishioners) with support from the parish nurse and pastoral associate will plan at least two days of activities per month (4-6 hours) which will include classes, prayer service, and social activities like cards, trivia, and singing (whatever is of interest). Lunch or breakfast will be included.
- Open an activity center for Northwest Milwaukee seniors, open at least two days a week, providing classes, field trips, social activities, volunteer opportunities, and meals for minimal costs.


COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT - Food Distribution


- Streamline the accounting system by using the same chart of accounts and QuickBooks Online for accounting at all three parishes. (IN PROGRESS)
- Prepare a common preferred vendor list for all three parishes for all maintenance.

- Investigate possible cost savings for all three parishes through volume discounts as services and supplies are purchased. (IN PROGRESS)
- The Director of Administrative Services together with parish leaders will develop a plan to ensure fiscal stability before existing building leases expire. (Example: HAPA extended their lease one more year through 2026). (IN PROGESS)





RECOMMENDED STEPS

- Start by providing service to those in the community who know us through our partners and our own programs to gain traction, momentum and much-needed trust as we begin.
- Keep affordable housing an active, viable and high priority assessment moving forward.
- Appoint a board of directors and hire a life center leader to implement start-up, engage the community and oversee operations.
- Implement the suggested plan as directed by life center leadership.







1. The financial portion of this strategy must be bold to deal with the current financial situation of the Northwest Milwaukee Catholic Parishes.

2. Communications with the parishes regarding strategic planning continues to be vitally important.



- 3. The life center plan is a necessary umbrella for vibrancy (with the reminder that it is as much about managing ALL outreach efforts for NWMCP as it is a physical location).
- 4. Evangelization efforts (especially as described by the work group) are necessary remembering that families and youth are important to membership growth and retention.
- 5. Any new hires prior to strategy finalization should be consistent with the skill sets and passion we anticipate for a "different" kind of staff.










On-going development of the strategic mission and vision for the vibrancy within the Northwest Catholic parishes continues.

CREATING ONE PASTORAL COUNCIL:

Over the past several years, we have united the St. Bernadette and OLGH Pastoral Councils. This Fall, all three parishes will come together under the leadership of one pastoral council.

When hiring staff replacements, we will seek individuals supportive of our collaborative efforts and who will live the mission and vision being developed through our strategic planning efforts.






MOVING FORWARD WITH THE STRATEGIC PLANNING:


LOVE ONE ANOTHER CAMPAIGN

We are embarking upon an exciting effort called the Love One Another Campaign. Each of the 188 parishes in the Archdiocese will participate in the campaign, and each family will be asked to make a pledge to support local parish needs and shared ministries. We will receive 60% of all funds we raise. Each of our churches in our collaboration face capital improvement expenses that need the help and support of our parishioners. This is going to be an enormous test for each community of faith — to rise up in this moment to support their particular faith community. Each parish has made clear that they would like to be here in the future — for that to happen we are going to need your support.


